must have a primary residence in one of the NSCC member cities. Additional information regarding NSCC scholarships is available at www.ctv15.org under NSCC Scholarship.

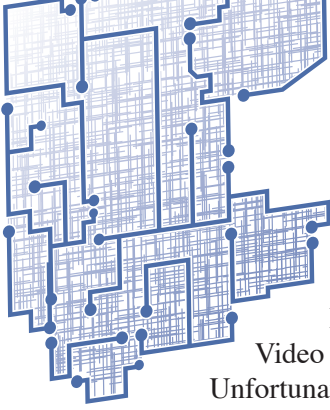

Sixth Circuit affirms FCC's video franchising rules

The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals released its decision on the appeal of the FCC's First Report & Order on Video Franchising on June 27, 2008. Unfortunately, the court upheld the FCC's order on every point.

The First Report & Order, which the FCC adopted in December 2006, primarily dealt with competitive franchises, but some of its rules applying to franchise fees could potentially affect CTV and the members of the North Suburban Communications Commission. The court's decision did help to some extent by acknowledging that financial support for capital costs includes "equipment"

as well as "facilities." The order had indicated that capital support only applied to "facilities," and that any funding for equipment could, therefore, be applied to the 5% franchise fee cap. Although the FCC, in its brief to the court, repudiated that assertion, the Sixth Circuit's acknowledgement is important.

While this decision may have more limited affect on our franchises, we are concerned about its implication for the Sixth Circuit's likely ruling on the appeal of the FCC's Second Report & Order on Video Franchising, which dealt with incumbent cable franchises. So far, however, Comcast has been cautious in its response to the Sixth Circuit decision, which will be appealed.

Keep Us Connected

In response to both state and federal challenges to PEG (Public, Educational and Government) access facilities, the Alliance for Community Media (ACM) developed a campaign called "Keep Us Connected" in an effort to educate Congress about the devastating effects that state franchising legislation and FCC rulings have had on community television. The campaign kicked off with visits to Capitol Hill during the ACM's annual conference in Washington, D.C., in July, and **Tim Domke**, CTV's Operations Manager, had a chance to visit with **Representative Betty McCollum's** staff and with **Senator Amy Klobuchar** and her staff.

Although Minnesota's legislature has so far declined to adopt a state franchising regulatory scheme, it isn't because Qwest and other local telephone companies in the state haven't tried. Furthermore, Minnesota is almost surrounded by states that have adopted state franchising, including Wisconsin, Illinois and Iowa. We are also concerned about the effect that recent rulings by the Federal Commissions

Commission will have on local cable franchising and PEG access operations.

We are already seeing some positive effects from the visits in Washington, D.C., with **Representative Jose Serrano** of New York, chair of the Appropriations Committee's Financial Services & General Government Subcommittee, scheduling a hearing on PEG access on September 17. Since that Committee holds the FCC's purse-strings, and since they are calling in the FCC, this seems like a good venue for challenging the FCC's December 2006 rulemaking.

In addition, the ACM's Public Policy Working Group is attempting to get language supporting PEG access in the platforms of both the Democratic and Republican National Parties. The hope is that we may eventually be successful in getting a legislative correction for some of the harm that has been inflicted on community television.

Two sessions of CTV's Video Kids Camp were scheduled this summer on Monday and Wednesday evenings. The first session, which ran from June 2 to July 19, was for 11-14 year olds. The second camp, which is in progress, runs from July 21 to August 30, and is for 15-18 year olds.



In seven weeks, students learned studio training, editing, camcorder, and production truck training. Along with the equipment training, the class developed their skills at conceptual planning and

learning to meet deadlines and goals. Upon completion of each camp, students

leave with four projects to showcase what they learned. The projects include two studio productions, one truck production, and one 2-5 minute documentary (subject chosen by student).

@tv Things you need to know

Hot weather alert! Remember, leaving portable equipment in your car on a hot day can cause problems for you - especially if the humidity is high and you go into an air-conditioned room to tape an event. Humidity combined with dry, cool air may cause condensation to build up in your camcorder resulting in your camcorder shutting down. Be sure to give yourself plenty of time for your equipment to adapt to the changing conditions. Also, watch out for your videotapes. Don't leave them in a hot car for too long. They will melt! If you don't believe me, come on in to CTV and ask to see the tape that was left in a car for just a few hours!

The gas bug is biting. CTV will now be charging a gas fee for some truck shoots. Those shoots would include location shoots that are out of our ten-city area. Speaking of truck shoots, can you

How to burn a DVD copy

Many certified editors have asked how to make a DVD copy of their project once it is finished. This quick little tutorial shows you how to quickly and easily burn a DVD from an edit suite.

The Simple Way to Export and Burn a DVD Using iDVD

Follow these simple steps (in Final Cut Pro):

- First, go to File>Export Using Quicktime in your FCP project. (In the pop-up submenu, make sure you: name your file, choose your saving destination, choose Current Settings, include Audio/Video, and have no markers.)
- Next, press Save on the lower right hand side, and you are done with the FCP part of this process.
- Open up iDVD, and ignore the pop-up menu in iDVD.
- Put your blank disc into the drive. (Press F12 on the keyboard to open and close the disc drive.)
- Go to File>One Step DVD from Movie. (This will pop up a browser window. All you have to do in this "one step" process is to choose the movie file you want to burn onto your disc.)
- Navigate to your .MOV movie file you previously exported. Click on it and press Import!

This information can also be found in the CTV User's Guide located in every edit suite and also in the studio control room. The User's Guide is full of helpful tidbits and easy to use mini-tutorials that many volunteers find helpful when troubleshooting an issue or figuring out a new application or workflow. If you are a certified editor, check this guide out if you haven't already!
